Thank you for making other arrangements for your children on Monday so we could meet as a staff and do some Professional Learning around the new curriculum and do some planning for 2024.

Professional Learning:

This involved reflecting on aspects of the new curriculum in terms of maths and the tools we have for recognising children's ability and next learning steps. We also reflected on some student voice we had gathered around maths in particular, and changes we might make to our practice to address these things.

We also discussed the Treaty of Waitangi, our obligation to give effect to it and ways that we might help bring a greater understanding to the history of it. As part of this we also discussed the Aotearoa New Zealand Histories Curriculum which is to be an integral part of our learning by next year. We had the priviledge of having Jaki Eales come to share a patere (chant with specific reference to the land) with us to not only improve our te reo Māori but also think about ways we can integrate stories from our past into our learning.

The Library:

We also participated in an online webinar about a new library system we are installing to help children engage more with our library. Unfortunately our library is currently out of bounds as the Ministry of Education works with us to try and remedy a problem with moisture that has got into the wall. We are hopeful this will be remedied by the start of the year and we will be able to bring the library to life in the new year.

Planning for 2024:

We took a look at the community consultation feedback along with some general student feedback and found some common things that we believe will be helpful to work on for next year. We drafted up some strategic thoughts that we will share with the Board (along with the whānau consultation) that will help them as they develop our strategic plan for the next two years.

Classes for 2024:

We are excited to inform you about the class make up for 2024 and teacher placement. It is quite the shuffle but there are well thought out and good reasons for it. I am so grateful for such a committed and collaborative team of teachers.

If your child has a reason for not swimming then please email their teacher with information otherwise we will try and find a solution for them to swim


