2023 was an exceptionally busy year for the PTA and successful one as we continue to focus our fundraising efforts on a new playground for the school.

Our goal for 2023 was to raise \$75,000. This figure was determined by the board's generous offer of matching funds raised dollar for dollar up to this amount. The good news is that we reached this goal with the current bank balance at \$78,000. We are now in a financially strong position to approach funders asking for their support. The Clutha Foundation has recently given us word of approving \$7000 towards the playground project.

Over the year we have successfully picked up numerous catering opportunities which have been very lucrative towards our fundefforts. raising The Lochiel Trailer Christmas Raffle was also amazingly supported and another huge success raising approximately \$20,000. A big thank you to Colin Hitchen who donated the Trailer, West Otago on Farm Servicing for the Pressure Cleaner, Ant Wallace Building for the Wheelbarrow, Dwains Service Centre for the Lawnmower, Campbell Dairy Ltd for the Firewood, and Blue Mountain Nurseries for the Garden Voucher. It was wonderful to see so many local businesses getting in behind this raffle and sponsor some wonderful prizes.

To have such a successful year wouldn't be possible without the wonderful PTA team who have worked so hard behind the scenes. We are all very busy in our own lives and it is great to see this school have such dedicated families to help Tapanui School grow.

Sadly Hazel Scott is leaving us, Hazel you will be sorely missed. Thank you for all your hard work while you have been on the PTA, you have been the driving force behind many of these fundraising efforts over the past 12 months, nothing is a problem and always up for a challenge!

Now that we have money in the bank then our focus for 2024 will become finalising some playground plans and applying for grants.
